System Approves Budget Change Proposal Focuses on Increase to Base Funding; Faculty Hiring and Support

On September 18, the California Community College Board of Governors (CCCBOG) approved the 2018-19 Budget Change Proposal (BCP), representing the priorities of the System for the upcoming budget year. All state agencies are required each fall to submit a BCP to the Department of Finance, which the Governor reviews before submitting his opening budget proposal to the Legislature in January. The Governor does not have a legal obligation to incorporate any of a state agency's BCP into his budget proposal.

As noted on the following page, the System's BCP for 2018-19 reflects a strong commitment to base funding, full-time faculty hiring, part-time faculty support, and professional development. For 2018-19, funding for growth and COLA are considered outside the BCP, which would add a considerable amount to the total. Also, the Chancellor and CCCBOG noted that next year's budget deliberations may result in funding for student support services not contained in the BCP.

Supreme Court to Hear Anti-Union Case FACCC Encourages Solidarity

The U.S. Supreme Court has officially agreed to hear *Janus v AFSCME*, challenging the constitutionality of union fair share dues.

Although FACCC, the faculty unions, and other labor organizations have expected this since the last election, it is nonetheless alarming that the true agenda is not the protection of free speech or freedom of association, but the destruction of union power in legislative and political activities.

Forty-two years ago, FACCC co-sponsored legislation allowing community college faculty to collectively bargain in California. The result has been improved faculty salaries and working conditions and an overall benefit to our students and our colleges.

FACCC urges you to reaffirm your commitment to your union, your academic senate, and to FACCC. If you are not a FACCC member, **join today**. The faculty voice can only be heard if we stand together in solidarity.

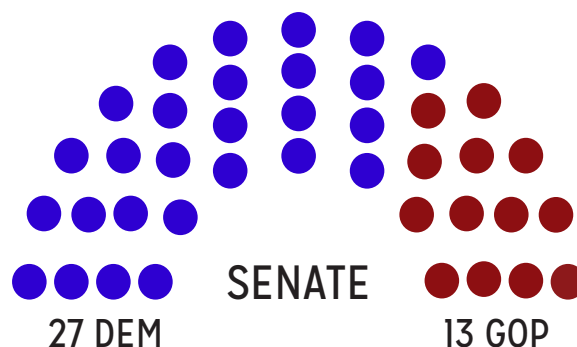
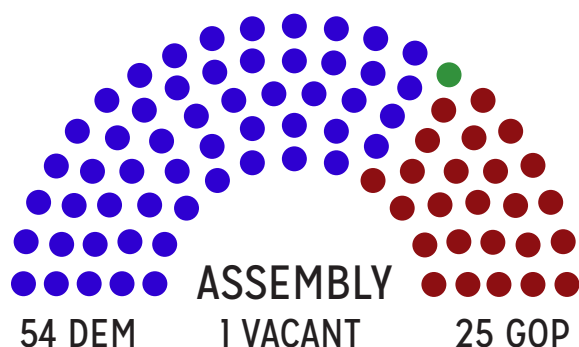

Faculty Issues

FACCC-sponsored **ACR 32** (Medina) calls on the Chancellor's Office to work with system stakeholders in identifying solutions to achieve 75% credit classroom instruction taught by full-time faculty, pay equity for part-time faculty, and develop goals for faculty in noncredit instruction. **Approved**

FACCC-sponsored **AB 310** (Medina) would require community college districts to report the extent they offer paid part-time faculty office hours. **Two-Year Bill**

CFT-Sponsored/FACCC-supported **AB 568** (Gonzalez Fletcher) would have provided up to six weeks of paid maternity leave for K-12 and community college educators. **Vetoed**

SB 285 (Atkins) prohibits public employers from deterring their employees from becoming or remaining members of an employee organization. **Approved**

CCCI/FACCC-cosponsored **AB 1651** (Reyes) provides additional protections for faculty placed on paid administrative leave. **Approved**

Student Services

FACCC-sponsored **AB 204** (Medina) would have increased fairness for students losing their Board of Governors Fee Waiver as a result of newly implemented academic progress standards. **Held in Senate Appropriations Committee**

AB 17 (Holden) would have provided access to reduced price or free transit passes for low-income students. **Vetoed**

AB 172 (Chavez) provides in-state tuition eligibility for dependents of military service members who apply for college while residing in California but move out of state prior to the time of enrollment. **Approved**

AB 214 (Weber) expands access to the CalFRESH program for low-income students and encourages colleges to implement on-campus food pantry programs or enter into agreements with local food banks. **Approved**

AB 1018 (Reyes) adds homeless and LGBT students to student equity plans and provides the Board of Governors with authority to add new student populations as needed. **Approved**
