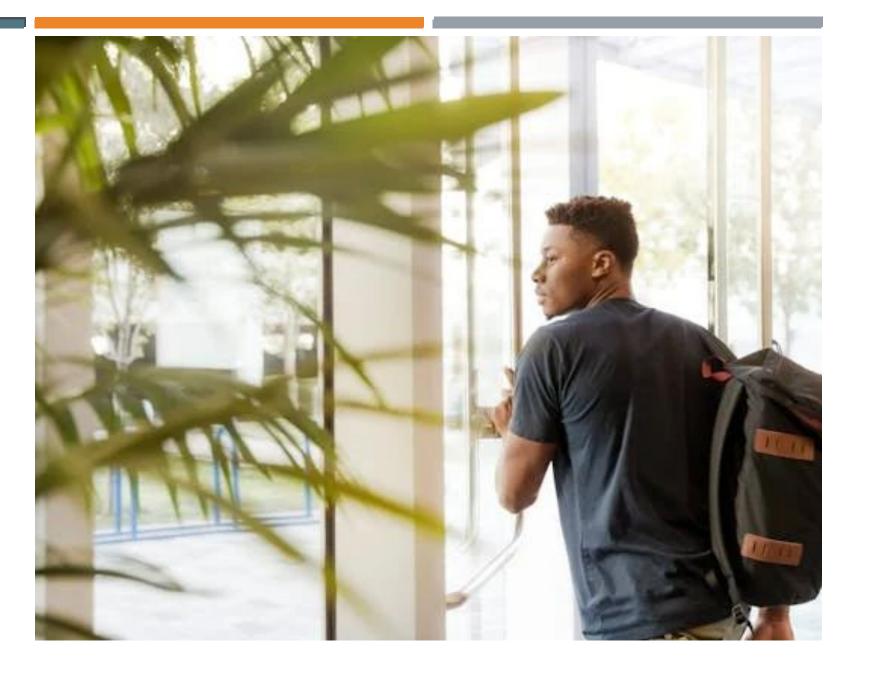

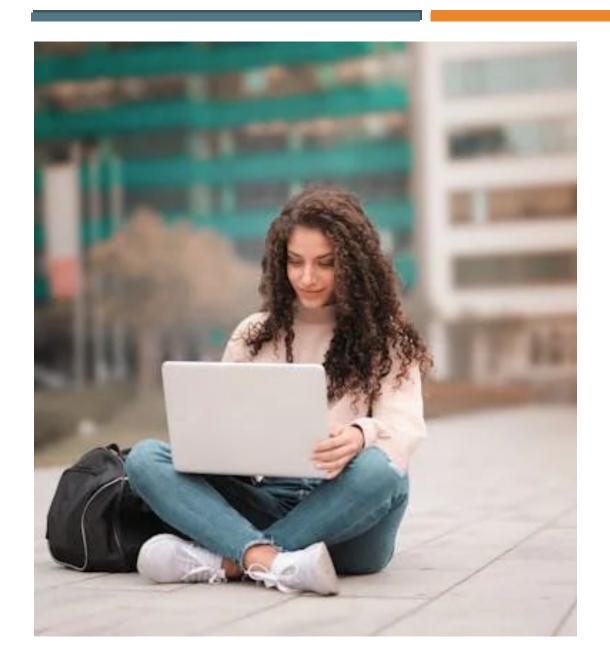

# WHAT ARE THE EFFECTS OF CAL-GETC?

- Will put everyone on an ADT Pathway, unless a student opts out.
- Transfer students will have to adhere to Cal-GETC standards unless they have catalog rights.

# CHANGES TO UC BOUND STUDENTS

# I. Oral Comm: Everyone will be required to take an oral communication course, even UC bound students-not admissions requirement

#### Changes to CSU Bound Students

- Math- CSU bound students will not be able to take Math XYZ to satisfy Cal-GETC.
- **Restrictive-** GE courses will be more restrictive for CSU bound students (Level I foreign language for Humanities, business communications, critical thinking courses limited, personal finance)
- **Grades-** CSU bound student will not be able to use C- and D grades to satisfy GE.
- ■CCC's will still be able to certify CSU bound st for the **American Institutions** requirement- Graduation requirement.

#### AREA IC: ORAL COMMUNICATION FOR CAL-GETC

I. The Cal-GETC Area IC (Oral Communication) requirement can only be fulfilled by a course taught in English (see Section 5.1.8). Cal-GETC Area IC (Oral Communication) can be fulfilled by an approved course that provides students with the foundational knowledge and practice of public speaking in a democratic society, to enable them to successfully communicate ideas of an informative and persuasive nature in the public speaking mode, and to critically evaluate the speeches of others.

#### **CURRICULUM**

- All 1C/A1 courses have been submitted for reevaluation for CalGETC Area 1C and decisions for most colleges have been made. However, they won't be visible on Assist until late Spring 2025.
- Courses approved at CCC are COMM C1000 .
- Remaining IGETC GE areas will be grandfathered in.
- Resubmitted American Institutions courses that will still be required by CSUs for graduation & may be double counted in Cal-GETC.
- <u>LOTE</u> will still be a graduation requirement for UC's, but is not part of Cal-GETC.
- Academic Regulations will also need to be changed.

#### PARTIAL CERTIFICATION

- I. Not allowed for the time being for Cal-GETC nor is there a Cal-GETC for STEM.
- 2. This may change in the future.
- 3. Partial IGETC and CSUGE is still acceptable if student has catalog rights and maintained continuous attendance.

#### STUDENT COMMUNICATION

- Cal-GETC not required for admissions for most majors.
- Cal-GETC will be required for students following ADTs (unless student has catalog rights to other GE pattern).
- Students following CSU GE need to be made aware to maintain catalog rights.
- HS students graduating Spring 2025 should be advised to take a course Summer 2025 to have the most GE options.

#### CATALOG RIGHTS-CALGETC

- I. Dual enrollment students who graduate Spring 2025 and start Fall 2025- Do not have catalog rights and must follow Cal-GETC.
- 2. Dual enrollment students who graduate Spring 2025 and start Summer 2025- May follow CSUGE, IGETC (with Ethnic Studies) or Cal-GETC if they maintain continuous enrollment.
- 3. The definition for catalog rights for CCC or CSU is attendance at a CCC or CSU I full semester or 2 quarters in an academic year.
- 4. The UC has no systemwide catalog rights policy. UC will continue to accept appropriate CCC certifications of IGETC and Cal-GETC for incoming students for the time being. However, there is a plan to phase out acceptance of IGETC. It probably won't happen sooner than 3 years.

#### CATALOG RIGHTS-CALGETC SCENARIOS

#### 3.4 Intersegmental General Education Transfer Pattern Transitional Certification Eligibility

Cal-GETC courses taken Fall 2025 or later may be applied towards IGETC certification if the courses are approved for the corresponding Cal-GETC Area. IGETC courses taken prior to Fall 2025 may be included in Cal-GETC certification if the courses are also approved for the corresponding Cal-GETC Area.

I.What Cal-GETC Standards 3.4 means in practice is that if a course is approved for an IGETC area, and continues to be approved under Cal-GETC for the same area, that course will be eligible to be used for either pattern. This is for all areas of IGETC and Cal-GETC, including Area 1C.

#### a. Scenario 1

I. A student completed a course in fall 2023 that is approved to satisfy Area 1C of IGETC. The course is also approved to satisfy Area 1C of Cal-GETC. The student may use the course for either IGETC or Cal-GETC certification.

#### b. Scenario 2

I. A student is being certified for IGETC. They take a course in fall 2025 that is approved for Cal-GETC Area 1C. The course was previously also approved for Area 1C under IGETC. The student may use the course to satisfy Area 1C of their IGETC certification.

#### c. Scenario 3

I. A student completed a course in fall 2023 that is approved to satisfy Area 1C of IGETC. The course **IS NOT** approved for Area 1C of Cal-GETC. The course may be used for IGETC certification as long as student has maintained continuous enrollment, but **may not** be used for Cal-GETC certification.

#### **CATALOG RIGHTS-**

- Review catalog rights at your individual college and make sure there is an understanding of what it is and continuous attendance definition
- Each CCC may have a different policy

#### ADT CATALOG RIGHTS EXAMPLES

- I. Student previously was fully CSU GE certified pre-Ethnic studies, but broke enrollment. Student returned to SMC and wants to complete ADT in Business 2.0. We can use the fully certified CSU GE to complete the ADT even though student broke catalog rights.
- 2. Student has catalog rights to Bus 1.0 ADT even though it's been phased out. Students in this situation should be advised to follow 2.0 since many of the CSUs are no longer accepting 1.0.
  - a. Contact individual CSUs to see if they will still accept 1.0 based on catalog rights.
  - b. CSUDH has said that they have no plans to phase out 1.0 and will accept 1.0 or 2.0.

#### WHO SHOULD FOLLOW AN ADT?

- Students who are applying to CSUs and have a similar major.
- Some impacted CSU campuses and majors may accept ADT, but students should follow major prep on Assist.
  - E.g. Business and Psychology to CSULB
- Many UC bound students complete an ADT by following major prep found on Assist- but ADT should not be their primary focus.
- All new students applying summer/fall 2025 and who indicate they want to transfer will be put on an ADT pathway unless they opt out.

## Common Course Numbering Language in Catalog

#### Verbiage for the Schedule of Classes and Catalog:

Starting Fall 2025, Santa Monica College and all California community colleges, will begin implementing **Common Course Numbering**. You will notice this change in six courses, with additional courses transitioning each semester until the initiative is complete. Be sure to check the course schedule and catalog carefully and we encourage you to reach out to a counselor if you have any questions!

The following course prefixes, course numbers, course names, and descriptions are going into effect Fall 2025:

SMC Course (prior to Fall 2025) → Common Course Numbering (effective Fall 2025)

COM ST 11, Elements of Public Speaking → COMM C1000, Introduction to Public Speaking

ENGL 1, Reading and Composition 1 → ENGL C1000, Academic Reading and Writing

ENGL 2, Critical Analysis and Intermediate Composition -> ENGL C1001, Critical Thinking and Writing

MATH 54, Elementary Statistics -> STAT C1000 Introduction to Statistics

POL SC 1, American and California Politics → POLS C1000 American Government and Politics

PSYCH 1, General Psychology → PSYC C1000 General Psychology

#### CAUTION WITH CCN

- For Phase 1 courses, they were approved in same area of Cal-GETC as they were in IGETC.
  - This may not be the case for other phases.
- Just because courses have the same CCN at different CCCs, doesn't mean the courses are articulated the same.
  - Should still look up on Assist to see how the course transfers to each specific UC or CSU campus.
- CCN is not necessarily the same as C-ID, therefore, courses may apply differently on ADTs.

# TMC Similarity – the CSU side

- Students that earn an ADT at a CCC must be able to complete the remaining requirements in 60 units
  - 9 units of upper division GE
  - Campus graduation requirements
  - Remaining major requirements
- Students must remain on that pathway to graduate with the guarantee
  - Adding a minor or any other type of program can negate the guarantee
- Earning more than one ADT does not automatically provide multiple guaranteed pathways at one institution

# TMC Similarity – the CSU side

- Finding similar pathways
  - TMC Search Site updated daily
  - ADT Pathways Site updated 3-5 times per year
- Some campuses accept a wide variety of ADTs into some of their more flexible majors
  - Ex. Dominguez Hills Chicana/o Studies, Psychology, Women's Studies
  - Ex. San Francisco English, Liberal Studies
