1. Report from Board Meeting

- Membership is down due to: Janus, loss of jobs, enrollment, etc.
- Enrollment has impacted our membership significantly, especially part-time faculty.

2. FACCC Election – Get out the vote

- A&P conference is a good opportunity to initiate conversation with faculty and ask them to serve on the board.
- A&P this year is a virtual event which makes it more difficult to recruit.
- Ideas to generate interest for running for the board:
 - Identify faculty on your campus and personally talk to them.
 - Bring back the "From the Desk of" emails.
 - Create a statement that describes the benefits of serving on the board.
 - \circ $\,$ Ask for testimonials from current and past board members on why they joined.
 - Pair the outgoing board member with an in-coming board member for training.
 - Create a document that describes what being on the board takes.
 - Mass email to drive interest to all the areas where we have open regional seats.
 - Use The Weekly to advertise open spots on the board.
 - Coffee hour at an event that would be about what FACCC is all about.
 - Highlight recruitment during A&P.
 - Open house: What is FACCC?
 - Be mindful of the pool of candidates.
 - Use the regional meetings during The Week of Action to get people to join FACCC and eventually possibly run for the board.
 - Ask committee members to run for the board.

• The faculty we know who are in poorly represented schools could be invited to the A&P, and when things go back to normal, bring them to Sacramento for a show and tell, buy them lunch.

3. FLEX Day FACCC presentations

- Have a FACCC event that we offer twice a year (or more) one or two hours long- during flex weeks; this would be Zoom sessions open to all faculty in California.
- Make sure faculty can count these events for flex hours.
- Ideas for these Zoom sessions:
 - Find out how to have your voice heard at the Capitol.
 - Offer a video that can be posted on the Vision for Success resource center through CCCCO so that it is accessible not just on flex week.
 - Offer something specifically for part-time faculty issues.
 - Cast a wider net in terms of accessibility and take the virtual opportunity to see who will join us.
 - This idea will be implemented on Zoom even if everything goes back to normal.
 - During the All Committee Day we will create a strategic plan for the year and we can take this conversation and continue during that day.
