RECENT LEGISLATIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 2021 AB 1326 (Arambula) - Requires counties to designate a staff person within their human services departments as a point of contact for public higher education counselors.
- 2022 AB 2315 (Arambula) - Requires community colleges to allow students, faculty, and staff to use their chosen names on all non-legal documents and programs.
- 2023 SB 467 (Portantino) - Removes barriers for undocumented students who use an ITIN for a background check to ensure they are not denied admission to a community college apprenticeship or internship training program.
- 2024 AB 2370 (Cervantes) - Ensures that the instructor of record for a community college course meets minimum qualifications to serve as a faculty member, including being a person.
- 2025 SB 241 (Cervantes) - Clarifies that the "instructor of record" for a community college course includes classroom instructors, librarians, counselors, EOPS, and all other faculty.

2026 FACCC ADVOCACY PRIORITIES



SPONSORED AND COSPONSORED LEGISLATION

AB 1171 (Patel) Part-Time Health Insurance Program

Requires district participation in part-time faculty health insurance program to improve equity and retention.

AB 2019 (Gipson) Faculty Deportation/Detainment Protection and Continuity

Allows community college faculty who are detained, deported, or denied re-entry due to immigration enforcement to continue performing their duties remotely.

AB 65 (Aguiar-Curry) Faculty Paid Pregnancy Leave Protection (Co-Sponsor)

Provides up to 14 weeks of fully paid pregnancy-related leave for community college employees.

BUDGET PRIORITIES

- **Support full repayment of deferrals** and one-time funding to address increased costs.
- **Ensure COLAs are provided for all categorical programs** to prevent erosion of student services and institutional purchasing power.
- **Oppose withholding the 2.41% cost-of-living-adjustment (COLA)** from districts not on the Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF).
- **Support the one-time \$100 million increase to the Student Support Block Grant.**
- **Support one-time funding for deferred maintenance** to ensure safe, accessible campuses.
- **Support Investing in faculty and basic needs:** Increase statewide funding for part-time office hours, improve health care access for part-time faculty, and expand food pantry access to part-time faculty.
- **Reform the SCFF** by increasing base funding, eliminating performance-based funding, and improving statewide data collection.
- **Oppose the \$38.1 million Calbright College funding increase.**
- **Oppose the \$41 million increase to the Common Cloud Data Platform**
- **Oppose \$100 million one-time funding to expand high school college-and-career pathway programs and dual enrollment.**
